Potential Health Effects of Overexposure

- **Inhalation:** High dust concentration can be irritating to respiratory system; coughing and labored breathing, possible temporary but reversible irritation in mucous membranes and respiratory tract.
- **Ingestion:** Irritating to mouth, throat and stomach. Rinse mouth vigorously and drink plenty of water. Do not induce vomiting. Consult a physician.
- **Skin Contact:** Can cause slight to moderate irritation. In combination with water, repeated or prolonged dermal exposure can cause moderate to severe alkali burns.
- **Eye Contact:** Can cause severe irritation, redness, tearing and blurred vision. Prolonged or repeated contact can cause burns and possibly corneal injury.
- **Chronic Exposure:** This product contains Crystalline (quartz) Silica which has been listed as a human carcinogen by NTP (Group 1) and IARC (Human Carcinogen) and a Suspected Human Carcinogen by ACGHIH (Category A2). Repeated or prolonged over exposure to free respirable Crystalline (quartz) Silica or silica can cause silicosis or other delayed and serious lung injury.

Section 04 – First Aid Measures

After Inhalation: Remove subject to fresh air. Administer oxygen if difficulty with breathing. Consult a physician.



After Ingestion:	Immediately seek medical attention. Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. If conscious drink plenty of water.
After Skin Contact:	Instantly wash skin with plenty of soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Wash clothing before reuse. Seek medical attention if symptoms persist.
After Eye Contact:	Rinse opened eye with plenty of running water for at least 15 minutes, lifting upper and lower eyelids occasionally. Consult immediately physician.

Engineering Controls:	Use with adequate general and local exhaust ventilation. Washing of the skin in the working area must be possible. Eye-wash bottle must be available.
Respiratory Protection:	Wear a properly fitted NIOSH approved respirator in poorly ventilated areas and/or if high dust concentrations are encountered.
Skin Protection:	When installing, wear appropriate protective rubber or plastic gloves to prevent hand-skin exposure. Wear appropriate impervious clothing to prevent skin exposure (long sleeve shirt and long pants).
Eye Protection:	Wear tightly sealed safety glasses with side shields or goggles. Face shield as necessary.
